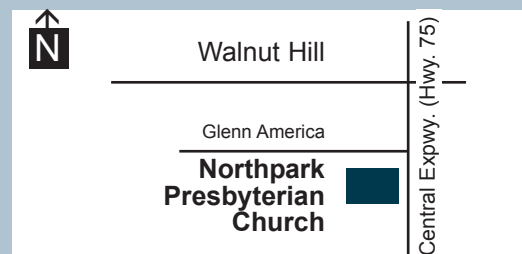

## CONDUCTORS



Arkady Fomin is the Founder and Artistic Director of the New Conservatory of Dallas. A native of Riga, Latvia, Mr. Fomin studied under noted Latvian violin professor, Voldemar Sturestep, and graduated from the Latvian Conservatory with a Master's Degree in Performance. As a chamber musician and soloist, Mr.

Fomin has collaborated in performances with many notable international artists, and has performed extensively throughout the world. Since 1975, he has been a leader in the Dallas musical community with his active performance schedule, his duties as violinist with the Dallas Symphony Orchestra, CLAVIER TRIO, and his dedication to music education. Mr. Fomin was honored as a recipient of the Cowlishaw Artist-in-Residence Award at the University of Texas at Dallas for artistic achievement and educational contributions to the City of Dallas.



Gary Needham, cellist, is conductor of the Conservatory Allegro Orchestra. Mr. Needham received his Bachelors in Music Education from Hardin-Simmons University and was Head Orchestra Director at Frankford Middle School in Plano, a program of over 220 students, including 3 performing groups that received the UIL "Sweepstakes" award and place in the Finals of the TMEA Middle/Junior High School Honor Orchestra Competition in 2001, 2003, and 2004. Mr. Needham is an active clinician/judge in the Dallas area and around the state and is the current Orchestra Director at the Lowery Freshman Center in Allen, Texas.

Amy Gearhart, violinist, conductor, earned a music degree from Hillsdale College in Michigan. As an undergraduate, she studied abroad at Oxford University. In 1997, she began teaching in Plano and was named Beginning Teacher of the Year for Haggard Middle School. Mrs. Gearhart

has also been assistant director at Plano Senior High School and, in 1999, became head orchestra director at Rice Middle School where the orchestra program grew from 60 to 240 members during her six year tenure. She was named the Marjorie Keller Young Teacher of the Year by the Texas Chapter of the American String Teachers Association in 2002. Currently, she teaches private violin and viola lessons, and with husband, Brad, resides in Allen with their daughters, Cassidy and Delaney.
